Not so long ago, people earned their dignity by birthright. If you were born a royal, you had dignity. Not born into the right class of people? No dignity for you. We may not live in a society that has such a class system today, but there are plenty of divides, prejudices, and life circumstances that erode dignity.

The truth of human dignity traces its deepest roots to the Imago Dei - latin for "Image of God" - found in the first book of the Bible. "So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." (Genesis 1:27)

The principle here is that people are a small picture of God. God created people to reflect the characteristics of the Creator. We are intellectual, moral, and spiritual beings as God is. As the divine is exceedingly valuable, so too people carry immeasurable worth. God created humans with dignity by design.

Programming for Dignity

Dignity by design is our model for treating one another with love at The Canby Center (TCC). Dignity is found in the 24,498 services The Canby Center provided in 2022. It is found in:

7,830 hot lunches served with a smile four days a week \$18,360 in rent and utilities assistance, keeping families in their homes 75 classes offered to youth and families to set them on path toward a hope-filled future And so much more!

In 2022, The Canby Center took thoughtful steps to strengthen our ability to serve our neighbors with dignity. Thanks to Canby Alliance Church, TCC installed new cabinets and a refrigerator for our Community Share, a place for food to be shared directly from neighbor to neighbor.

In 2022 we strengthened our staff by adding Joy Thom - Director of Programs, Mark Smith - Director of Expansion, Brooke Spencer - Elementary Programs Coordinator, and Steve Brightman - Facilities Specialist. Christina Ramirez transitioned to Assistant Director of Programs and Mimi Flores transitioned to Guest Services Coordinator. Each of our staff plays a critical role in extending TCC's value of dignity to our guests and members.

Building for Dignity

Dignity by design informs The Canby Center's future too! In 2023, The Canby Center has plans to triple the size of our facility at our current location. The new TCC building is intentionally designed for dignity. The space will be highly functional, well lit, clean, and beautiful. In the same way that cathedrals were built to direct the attention of people to God, this space is being built to help people feel valued and loved by God.

Dignity in the design of our programming and dignity in the design of our building are rooted in the dignity in God's design of all people. I hope that as you thumb through this annual report you see the creativity of God in loving and caring for people!

Meeting Practical Needs

TCC supports Canby families in practical ways all year long! Special events like the annual backpack distribution, Strengthening Relationships Classes, and financial support for those who qualify are all designed to meet families at their point of need and share hope!

Helping Families Thrive

The goal of the Thriving Together Program is in the name: thriving. In this no-cost membership-based program, families receive access to wholesome food, quality clothing, and more. Encouraging families to move toward self-sufficiency, members volunteer at TCC one hour a month, build skills in financial literacy through finance class options, and engage in their own growth through Hopes and Dreams coaching.

BLUEPRINTS FOR SUCCESS: THRIVING TOGETHER

SUMMER 2018 ----

Thriving Together launches. Year one averaged 89 active weekly members.

FALL 2019

Thriving Together celebrated 10 members who made significant movement towards their Hopes and Dreams goals. Thriving Together is working!

2020

TCC hires a full-time Thriving Together Coordinator! The program pivoted to a drive-thru food distribution model during Covid-19, serving 6x the previous Thriving Together capacity at the height of the pandemic.

2021

Indoor food shopping returns and volunteering opportunities, too!

2022

Thriving Together returns to full membership programming. 150 families shopping for food on average weekly. Over 200 attended Basic Finance classes.

LOOKING AHEAD

Thriving Together will continue throughout the upcoming building process. The Hopes and Dreams coaching team will expand to support families in achieving their goals.

Churches, businesses, service clubs, foundations, and individuals are all key participants in achieving our mission. Together, they form a solid foundation for The Canby Center to meet the needs of hundreds of families, week after week.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Embold Credit Union, Canby Builders Supply, Clarity Financial, Wilcox Arredondo & Co., DirectLink, and over 30 other businesses rallied to meet the needs of the community throughout the year with timely and generous financial support.

Over **20 Canby area churches** contributed regularly, supporting the work by sending volunteers, food, and clothing. This spring, generous gifts from **Canby Alliance Church** allowed TCC to install new Community Share cabinets and refrigeration to keep food available and secure for public access.

Caruso Produce, WinCo Distribution, Dave's Killer Bread, and other faithful gift-in-kind donors contributed over 600,000 lbs of food! This support sustains much of the food distribution work of TCC, putting nutritious and necessary food directly into the hands of our neighbors.

The M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust, Epping Family Foundation, Ford Family Foundation, Canby Rotary Foundation, and 16 other foundations supported The Canby Center through generous grants to bolster TCC programs and expansion plans.

Reading Mentors inspires a love for reading by providing students with consistent oneon-one reading time with a caring adult. In partnership with the Canby School District, the Reading Mentors program quickly jumped back into action to serve Canby's kids after pausing due to Covid-19.



BLUEPRINTS FOR SUCCESS: READING MENTORS

FALL 2016 ----

Reading Mentors pilot program introduced at Knight **Elementary School.**

2017 -----

Data shows that students with a reading mentor showed more growth than those not in the program. Two more elementary schools are added to the program.

FALL 2018 -----

Reading Mentors is operating in all 6 CSD elementary schools.

2019-2020 -----

Reading Mentors is serving 158 students a month, with 1,772 hours of volunteer time given.

MARCH 2020 -----

Like many other programs, Reading Mentors had to pause during the height of the Covid-19 pandemic.

FALL 2022 -----

Reading Mentors relaunches in 3 Canby elementary schools, serving 62 students! Forty-five amazing volunteers were quick to sign up as mentors.

LOOKING AHEAD

TCC expects to be back in all 6 Canby elementary schools in spring 2023. More students means more inspired learners!

In 2023, The Canby Center plans to triple the size of the facility at our current location. This strategic goal has been in development for over five years and thoughtfully designed to ensure dignity-enhancing programs for the next 30+ years of service. More than simply raising up a new building, this project has been carefully planned to achieve the following initiatives:

- Raising hope through a **Building Strength** expansion project that will triple the current floor plan, offering bright and inviting spaces for learning, activities, and resource distribution.
- Raising community reach by Widening Impact through program expansion and replication to neighboring communities.
- Raising a bright future through a Thriving Legacy Fund that ensures building sustainability for years to come.

The growth of The Canby Center since it's early days in 2007 has created new opportunities to serve the Canby area. In fact, we are running out of space! As TCC continues to serve a growing community, expanding the facility is the path to poverty alleviation for years to come.


